Born 7 April, 1935 to Wallace Gerald and Gertrude Elsa Scott in Four Corners, Kaw County, Okla. He was baptized 3 June 1951. Graduated from High School and entered college. On 20 April, 1956 he wed Miss Marion Geneva Warren, a marriage that lasted for more than 49 years. They became the parents of Vicki Lynn 1957 and Stanley W. 1962. Houston became their home in 1969.

The Scotts attended the Brookhollow congregation where he served as a deacon and song leader. For a short time he and Geneva worshipped with the Fleetwood, Spring and Melrose congregations before placing membership here at Candlelight, 3 July of this year.

He was employed for many years with Western Geophysical in seismographic work. Too restless for complete retirement, he worked for a short time for Maxim Medical, and later for Wal-Mart.

Carl was the former President of the North Harris County Dulcimer Society.

To the shock of all, he became ill, was taken to Memorial City Hospital for tests, and was then removed to Memorial Hermann Hospital (Medical Center) I. C. U. on Monday and died 3:30 AM Thursday 3 November.
